


Welcome to Norwich Arts Centre.

For our bar, we take care to select local produce where possible and work with suppliers who take their environmental responsibility seriously.

Some of our suppliers are Adnams, Melville and Mayell, Norfolk Gin, Gyre & Gimble, St Giles, Redwell Brewery and Wildcraft Brewery. Adnam's Kobold English Lager supports the work of the Blue Marine Foundation. Wildcraft brewery forage for many of their ingredients. Innovative Gin-makers Gyre & Gimble have a (almost) zero-waste cocktail bar.

NAC awarded Gold Level with Norfolk Carbon Charter






NAC supported The Neutrinos to go to COP26 Climate Conference in Glasgow to perform Darkroom, a one audience member sound and senses performance in complete darkness.
